Dress/ Tunic/ Shirt/ Pants/ Shorts <i>Girls</i>	Summer (Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri) * <u>Preferred</u> : Tartan dress Or *White button up shirt with tartan shorts Sport (Wednesday) * Yellow polo shirt with maroon shorts/netball skirt (summer)
